Create Inclusive is a group of filmmakers who make films using 'Claymation'. In other words, 'Wallace and Gromit' style movies.

Adults with Learning disabilities work with professional animation artists and technicians to make short films for public screening covering topics that explore their own lives, the experiences of others or stories that are simple loads of fun to make using plasticine.

'Create Inclusive' support members of the community to make their own films. We work in secondary schools, primary schools, special schools, colleges and with community groups. We also work with youth groups, disability groups, and advocacy groups and in the commercial sector.

Much of our corporate work is concerned with delivering 'Team Building'.

Our workshops are aimed at any group who are looking for a fun way to improve communication, familiarise themselves with working with people who have disabilities, bond, develop future goals, or simply reconnect with each other.

Our workshops are unique in their style of delivery. Learning disabled facilitators introduce the activity and support the creative process. Teams are invited to re-create their working practices through making a parallel claymation film whilst mingling with disability in a natural working environment.

Our workshops are highly motivational, thoroughly enjoyable and delivered with a very interactive inclusive style. They can run for a few hours, a day or several days, dependant on how far the team want to go to make their film to include sound, music or special effects.

The emphasis is on having a fun where the team can move forward together with common goals and learn how to communicate using more creative methodologies. Every delegate will take away something useful which will help their personal, as well as their teams, development.
